Nova Scotia used a two-step approach to allocate applications to Designated Learning Institutions.

Step 1. Base allocation formulas utilized historical data and principles such as stabilizing institution enrolments, normative application levels, and conversion success rates (translating study permit applications to approved study permits)

Step 2. A modest adjustment was provided to Private Career Colleges with low base allocation who offer high priority programming and to universities with plans and capacity for growth. In addition, 99 application allocations are held back by the Province to provide flexibility for unanticipated circumstances or to support future priority programming.
